are a bit more worn from praying, especially during the pandemic.



# Beat the Budget is a SUCCESS!!!

At the beginning of September, we launched a fundraiser called "Beat the

Budget". The goal was to raise \$10,000 by receiving \$5,000 in donations from the congregation. These funds would be matched using the interest from an existing GIC. Everyone who donated had a chance to win two tickets to an Arts on 817 concert as an incentive. The goal was met and surpassed by Sept. 24. At the Sept Council meeting, we discussed how to proceed. It was decided that we would continue the fundraiser but any future donations would not be matched. Some people of the congregation came up with some creative ideas for raising money. Some of these included selling homemade trifle, crab-apple jelly, handmade dishcloths and farm fresh honey. On Oct.29, we had a party to celebrate the meeting and surpassing of our goal. The party was complete with noisemakers, sparklers and a cake. On Nov. 5, we drew for the Arts on 817 tickets. It was a very successful fundraiser to help support the Local fund. We raised \$9,224 from the congregation plus the \$5,000 of interest money totalling \$14,224. A heartfelt thank you goes out to the gen-• erous people of our congregation. 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 "Remember this, whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.
